St Catherine's School acknowledges the Gadigal and Bidjigal people, the traditional owners of the lands on which the school sits, and pay our respects to Elders past and present. St Catherine's boarders have the longest history of any girls at the school. Our first three girls were sisters, and when they began their boarding experience on 5 March 1856, Mrs Barker commented in her diary, "poor things, they were rather tearful when left by their parents, but I doubt not they will soon be happy" (Croft, 1996). And they were. Since that day, St Catherine's has had a flourishing boarding house, where girls from a wide variety of backgrounds come together to continue this strong boarding tradition.

Over the years, the boarding house and the school have changed considerably. Today's boarding students live in a modern, welcoming environment located in the most historic part of the school. From taking care of their rooms, to helping new boarders settle in, to daily life with each other, our boarders

develop skills of independence and self-efficacy, as well as learning how to live well with others. They also form friendships that last a lifetime. The boarding community in turn enhances the school by making it a home, infusing it with vitality, depth and heart.

We welcome girls from Year 7 to Year 12, from Australia and overseas. If you are considering a boarding experience for your daughter, we would be delighted to discuss with you what boarding has to offer.

Our boarding staff

Five permanent boarding staff live on-site and are available to assist the girls. The team works collaboratively to ensure each boarding student is well supported and nurtured during her time with us.



MS CHELSEA SLADE DIRECTOR OF BOARDING

Chelsea oversees the boarding house and is responsible for all boarders, their welfare and development. She is also our Indigenous Student Coordinator and serves to provide support and guidance to our Indigenous students during their time at St Catherine's.

She is passionate and loves the diversity of daily life in the boarding house, from going on Sunday outings to attending doctors' appointments with boarders. She lives on-site in the boarding house and is the person the boarders tend to rely on when they need something overnight.

Kate grew up in Mudgee and understands what it is like to be a boarder as she boarded from Year 9. This is where her passion for all things boarding started.

The boarding house

The boarding house is your home away from home. Its layout is designed to provide the comforts of home and freedom to move and enable students to perform school tasks and work individually when required. When you join our boarding family, you will automatically have 65 sisters. Australian girls from the city or country and overseas girls live together in our boarding house. The newly renovated boarding house has comfortable modern living areas with some twin rooms and single rooms with ample desk space, storage, clever shelving and lighting. Each student has privacy for study and rest.

Girls are encouraged to add a personal touch to their rooms – it is their home away from home after all. Delicious, varied and nutritionally balanced meals are prepared by our chef. Polite and considered language is expected and only English is spoken in the boarding house common rooms, dining room, and during prep time.

Boarders have access to Netflix and Smart TVs, and there is Wi-Fi in all areas of the boarding house. Boarders can utilise the school's facilities including the swimming pool, sports centre, music practice rooms and gymnasium. All students, day girls and boarders, can use the library from 7.30am until the start of school at 8.20am, and at recess and lunch. All boarders come to the prep centre after dinner at 7.00pm, with Years 7–9 staying until 8.30pm and Years 10–12 until 9.00pm.

The prep centre is a fantastic resource where the girls have access to teaching staff for after school hours assistance and older current students who can provide support and mentorship.


St Catherine's School Sydney is located in the exclusive eastern suburbs, in the safe residential area of Waverley.

Our students are encouraged to experience everything Sydney has to offer. We encourage the outdoor lifestyle as it encapsulates the Sydney experience.

We are just a kilometre from the magnificent Bronte Beach and three kilometres from the world-renowned Bondi Beach.

Close by is the beautiful Queens Park where boarders have access to exercise facilities. The Sydney CBD and Sydney domestic and international airports are also all just 20 minutes away.

Our local shopping village also provides access to a range of facilities such as chemists, doctors, bakery, cafes, hairdressers, gift shops and a post office. Bondi Junction, a major transport, shopping and entertainment hub is only a 10-minute walk from the school.



Why be a boarder?

Our boarders build strong, lifelong friendships with both Australian and overseas students.

Your daughter will learn to live away from home and become independent, resourceful, confident and well-educated. We encourage our boarders to completely immerse themselves into life at St Catherine's. Students flourish both socially and emotionally when they engage in the broad cocurricular activities available to them as boarders.

When you join the boarding community, you will do so with mixed emotions. Remember you are not alone, and it is likely that many others are experiencing similar feelings to you.

We suggest the following:

GIVE IT TIME

Moving schools and deciding to become a boarder is a huge change and allowing yourself to get used to the change is very important. Try to take one day at a time. Life will start to get easier for you once you get familiar with the daily routines and when you start to form new friendships.

STAY IN TOUCH WITH YOUR OLD FRIENDS

Stay in touch with family and friends and if they are in the vicinity of the boarding house, invite them to visit you in your new surroundings.

TAKE THE INITIATIVE

Don't wait for others to come to you. Take the opportunity to invite a person, or two, from your year group to go with you to explore the local shopping village.

MAKE YOUR PRIVATE SPACE SPECIAL

Bring some of your favourite things from home to decorate your room. Posters, photos, your doona, ornaments and even a bedside rug can make your space feel more comfortable and yours!

GET INVOLVED

The school offers many cocurricular activities such as drama, sport, music, debating and dance.

All boarders in Years 7-10 must be involved in at least one cocurricular activity each term. We prefer students to be involved in at least two activities at the school, including one physical activity.

SEEK ASSISTANCE WHEN YOU NEED

There are many staff here to help, both in the boarding house and day school. The best way to get help is to ask.



Academic benefits

In the boarding house, close communication between the class teachers and boarding house staff ensures that the girls' study program meets the expectations of the girls, their parents and our teaching staff. We have strong tracking processes in place, and we know when things are going well or if there are areas requiring improvement.

St Catherine's teaching is intentionally tailored to girls. It is free from gender stereotyping, unconscious bias and social pressure from the opposite sex. Studies have proven that girls who attend an all girls' school have higher self-esteem and confidence. This prepares students for life beyond school.

We have strong educational relationships with independent boys' schools and offer one of the broadest curriculum choices of all Sydney girls' schools.

St Catherine's offers the Higher School Certificate (HSC), with up to 40 courses on offer in Years 11-12.

St Catherine's is an academically non-selective school, and given this, our students' results are consistently outstanding.

In 2022, we ranked 13th in the state, with 57% of our students achieving an ATAR over 90.

Two students also received a top ATAR of 99.9, while our median ATAR was 91.50.

We also had a student come first in the state in English as an Additional Language/Dialect, with a further three students placing within the top ten in this subject.

St Catherine's students also placed second in the state in drama and third place in economics.
