SCHOLARSHIP FUND

FAITH PATTERSON SCHOLARSHIP

During 2015 the foundation launched an appeal to raise funds for the Faith Patterson Scholarship in memory of our former headmistress. This means-tested scholarship was introduced in 2019 for a student in Years 11 and 12. It covers 50% of tuition fees. Our funds need to grow so that we can continue to expand this scholarship offering.

INDIGENOUS EDUCATION PROGRAM

St Catherine's has a long history of educating young women from Aboriginal and Torres Strait Island communities. We currently have 17 Indigenous students in the senior school. Students are financially supported by their families, the school and our partnership with organisations such as the Australian Indigenous Education Foundation.

Our Indigenous students have enriched the cultural fabric of our school, and gone on to achieve great things for themselves and their communities. You can help us to continue and expand our Indigenous Education Program by donating to our scholarship fund.
